
The See Subi on Sunday walks work on the same basis as a group of friends walking together, who invite others to join them. Everyone taking part in any of the walks does so at their own risk.




2019–2020 free guided walks exploring the history and environment of Subiaco

The walks take approximately one and a half hours to complete and are suitable for people of all ages. Walks are conducted in a relaxed, friendly and informative manner.

Community members with past and present connections to the areas visited are invited to provide personal anecdotes that enhance the appreciation of the location explored during each walk.

- 1  **Eighteenth anniversary walk – Spotlight on Subiaco**
Sunday 14 July 2019
at 1.30pm
Subiaco was proclaimed a Municipality in 1897

and became a City in 1952. Ride the Subiaco tram through the city, learn the history of the tram and the beautiful leadlights, and enjoy the leafy streets, architecture and other special features which abound in the city centre. Join us for an Anzac biscuit and “billy tea” at completion of the walk.

Start and finish on the grassed area in front of the Subiaco Museum, 239 Rokeby Road, Subiaco.

- 2  **Historic Happenings**
Sunday
8 September 2019
at 1.30pm
Subiaco Oval has a significant history and a new history is being created with the new major developments at the oval site and in East Subiaco.

Start and finish at Market Square rotunda, corner Haydn Bunton Drive and Roberts Road, Subiaco.

- 3  **Shaping Shenton**
Sunday
10 November 2019
at 1.30pm
Shenton Park developed with the opening of the railway in 1881 and building of Workers Homes Act homes between 1912 and 1914. Explore the railway precinct of Shenton Park and learn about the area's interesting history and eclectic housing.

Start and finish at the park on the corner of Railway road and Rankin Road, Shenton Park.

- 4  **Designed Daglish**
Sunday
12 January 2020
at 1.30pm
Daglish is a garden suburb with pocket parks established

following the opening of the railway station in 1925. Learn of the history and heritage of Daglish which was chosen as a suitable “suburb” for the establishment of workers’ homes.

Start and finish at the park on the corner of McCallum Avenue and Stubbs Terrace, Daglish.

- 5  **Firm Foundations**
Sunday
8 March 2020
at 1.30pm
Benedictine Monks settled in the area in 1851 and built

a monastery named New Subiaco. Learn of their contribution and the foundations laid by other civic minded people as the historic precinct radiating from Subiaco Station is explored.

Start and finish at the fountain in Subiaco Square north of Subiaco Railway Station.

- 6  **Maternal Matters**
Sunday
10 May 2020
at 1.30pm
On Mother's Day, we acknowledge Mothers by visiting relaxing and beautiful places, including KEMH which has a special significance for many. Bring a picnic lunch or afternoon tea and relax with Mum in the beautiful Subiaco Theatre Gardens before or after the walk.

Start and finish at Subiaco Theatre Gardens, Bagot Road, Subiaco.
