City of Subiaco and Rosalie Primary School put green thumbs into action

The city provided Rosalie Primary School with \$500 funding, as well as in-kind support, to put towards its environmental improvement projects.

Mayor Heather Henderson said the city looks to the community to come together to improve the local environment.

“It is important for children to be aware of both the local and broader environmental issues and how they can support conservation efforts,” Mayor Henderson said.

The city’s funds assisted Rosalie Primary School to purchase six ornamental pears, which will provide greenery and shade in summer and allow sunlight through to classrooms in winter.

A range of native and waterwise understory species were also planted in the school’s new garden beds.

The city also provided concrete pavers that had been removed during the recent footpath upgrade along Keightley Road, which were used to pave their bike locker area.

Rosalie Primary School’s P&C held a busy bee on Sunday 14 April to complete these environmental projects.

The primary school together with the adjacent Rosalie Park, provide an important connection for wildlife to move between Kings Park, Lake Jualbup and the rail reserve.
