Artists capture Subiaco's industrial past

Young, local artists will transform the Bosich site in Subiaco this weekend to mark a milestone in the city's redevelopment of the Carter Lane precinct.

Contemporary artists Jackson Harvey, J'aime Fazackerley and Alex Miller, who represent the Little Wing Corner Gallery, will create a temporary public art series titled *Transition Zone*.

The artworks will be an interpretation of the site's transition from industrial land to residential, mixed-use commercial and public open space.

Mayor Heather Henderson said: "The city is thrilled to be working with these up-and-coming artists to celebrate Subiaco's identity and local history.

"In the space of three days, the artists will produce large painted murals and record film and photographs for future exhibition, before the site is handed over to demolition contractors."

The Bosich site is one of the last pockets of land representing Subiaco's industrial past and working class roots.

The Mayor noted: "The original building was constructed in the 1940s during the period of post-war prosperity. Subiaco's industrial area was of key importance to the state's economy."

The Bosich site is bound by Juniper Bank Way, Centro Avenue, Carter Lane and Flood Street.
