## **Visit Paris in the 1930s at sunset@subi**

Belleville Gypsy Swing will be the first to bring sunset@subi to the beautiful Oak Lawn at The University of Western Australia on Sunday 10 February.

Belleville is an acoustic gypsy swing quartet that is carrying on the traditions of the gypsy jazz created by Django Reinhardt and Stephane Grappelli.

Performing music from the Paris scene in the 1930s, combined with songs from the modern Gypsy Jazz repertoire, the group's energy on stage and enjoyment of raw musical pleasure is infectious.

Belleville's foot tapping and hand clapping swing will have audiences wanting more.

Violinist Charlie McCarthy described Belleville's sound as a cross between pulling up to a red light and the guy in front of you nudges up so you can make a left turn, and picking up a Q and a U at the same time in Scrabble.

"We don't perform chin-stroking jazz; our style of music will have you up and moving," Charlie said.

Bring a picnic and a blanket or low chairs to Oak Lawn, The University of Western Australia, Hackett Drive, Crawley between 5pm and 7pm and dance along to Belleville.

The sunset@subi free community concert series covers a mix of themes and genres suitable for all ages. The series runs every Sunday through to 27 February from 5pm to 7pm at various parks and reserves within the City of Subiaco.
