Six for six at Subiaco Museum

Artist Christopher Young has taken an intimate look at the characteristics of fourteen homes in Subiaco, as part of new exhibition *Six* now on display at Subiaco Museum.

Christopher curated the exhibition as an artist in residence supported by the Department of Culture and the Arts' Connect – Community Collections program.

Mayor Heather Henderson said: "This exhibition shows a unique side of Subiaco's heritage, and it is wonderful to see how our history can inspire an artist."

Christopher has spent the past year exploring and photographing the lives of Subiaco residents living in houses that are often more than one hundred years old.

His photographs depict a mix of the everyday experience set alongside the more personal shrine-like displays present in each of the homes.

Christopher has also conducted a range of interviews with local residents that feature in the exhibition alongside his photographs and objects from the houses.

Mayor Henderson added: "Christopher has captured the look and feel of Subiaco as well as the diverse range of personalities that live in our old houses."

Subiaco Museum is open from Tuesday to Sunday from 2pm to 5pm. The museum is located at 239 Rokeby Road, Subiaco, between Subiaco Library and the city's Administration Centre.
