Youth program, local cafe nurture young baristas

The City of Subiaco will host a free evening barista skills workshop for young people aged sixteen to twenty-one at Café Café in Subiaco on Monday 22 December.

Starting at 6.30pm, the two hour workshop will teach participants the fundamental skills needed to make coffee – bean selection, grinding, extraction and milk steaming.

The workshop is part of the city's Upskill youth program, which provides opportunities for young people to learn new skills.

City of Subiaco Director Community Development Jo Sadler said: "Upskill delivers a mix of fun activities in workshop style sessions that contribute to young people's professional and personal development."

She explained: "Program content has been guided by issues highlighted by the youth sector as being most important to young people as well as input from the city's youth advisory group Subi Voice of Youth."

The barista workshop will take place at Café Café, Shop 20, Subiaco Square, Subiaco, opposite Subiaco Train Station.
