Eighty-four finalist entries in the 2014 Photographic Awards are now on display at Subiaco Library until Wednesday 19 November.

Community members are encouraged to vote for their favourite photograph in the People's Choice Awards, by Sunday 16 November.

The two categories are 'Subiaco' and 'Open'; with residents able to submit up to two of their photographs in each category.

Mayor Heather Henderson said: "I really encourage community members to visit the exhibition and select their favourite image; the entries this year are outstanding and a great representation of Subiaco."

The judging panel consists of Western Australian education and industry representatives who will select the award-winning photographers. Criteria includes relevance, composition, creativity, technical quality and overall impression.

"It is lovely to see so many entries across all age groups that highlight different aspects of the city," the mayor added.

Prizes will be awarded to the best photograph from primary and secondary school student entrants and the best overall entrant at a ceremony held at Subiaco Library in November.
