

LPS 5 UPDATE

The City of Subiaco is in the process of reviewing feedback on draft Local Planning Scheme No. 5 (LPS 5) and the draft Local Planning Strategy.

1041 submissions were received on draft LPS 5 and 306 submissions on the draft strategy. This community response will guide the Council on the next steps of the process.

The city is currently analysing the submissions to identify the issues raised and understand the concerns of the community. Once all the feedback has been analysed, the city will contact everyone who made a submission and provide a summary of the findings.

The results of this community feedback will inform Council's response to the Western Australian Planning Commission about the advertised documents.
