Earlier this year, the city was awarded Platinum Waterwise Council of the Year for demonstrating an ongoing commitment to creating a water-sensitive community through its projects and programs. The annual *Waterwise Verge and Garden Awards* is one of the great initiatives that helped the city achieve this status.

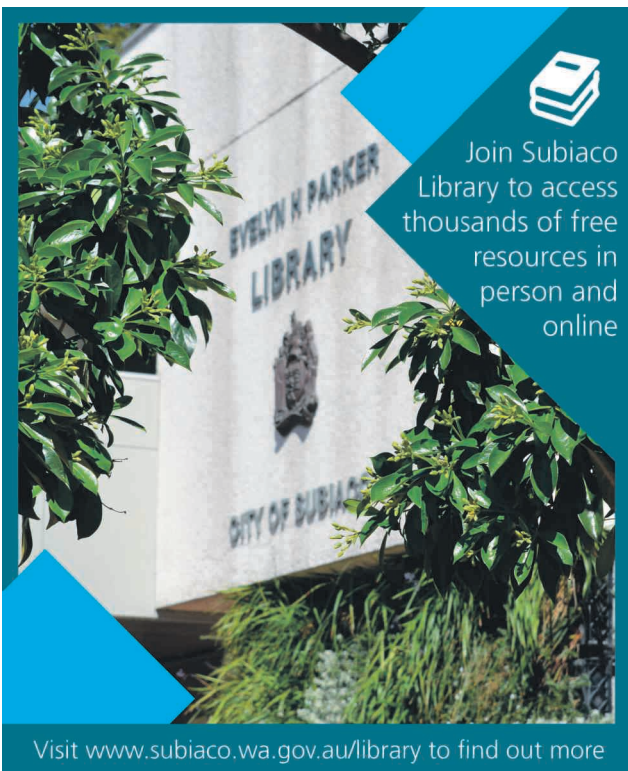
