### DON'T MISS CINEMA SUBIACO – EXHIBITION CLOSING SOON

Subiaco Museum's *Cinema Subiaco: 1904–1954* exhibition celebrates cinema culture in our city, which has been the home of several picture gardens, from Subiaco Oval to Shenton Park.

Before it was the Regal Theatre, the Coliseum Picture Gardens operated from 1916 to 1938. Avid cinema aficionado and travelling projectionist Paddy Baker bought the Regal Theatre in 1946.

*Cinema Subiaco: 1904–1954* brings to life the colourful story of Paddy Baker and his important contribution to Subiaco, preserving the Regal Theatre for generations to come.

Visit the exhibition before **Saturday 3 November** discover an intimate history of cinema culture, an original projector owned by Paddy Baker and vintage movie posters.
