New exhibition arrives at Subiaco Museum

New environmental grant secured

The City of Subiaco has secured a \$20,000 grant to hold a community planting day and extend its existing Waterwise Verge Restoration Program.

The grant comes from the Government's Communities Environment Program through Federal Member for Curtin, Celia Hammond, and will nearly double the number of residents who can transform their verges under the program.

The City's current Waterwise Verge Restoration Program helps residents plant natives, which require less water, fertiliser and weed control.

The program also increases biodiversity, and keeps local streets and neighbourhoods looking good.

A community planting event will also be planned to encourage residents, volunteers and other community members to plant natives together on their verges.

Pop-up Library still open

Recycling update

After the fire at Cleanaway's Material Recovery Facility in Guildford late last year, the City of Subiaco sought an alternative to process recycling while Cleanaway rebuilds.

The Southern Metropolitan Regional Council (SMRC) is now ramping up capacity at its waste facility and was prepared to accept the City's recycling from 6 January 2020. The City and SMRC worked together to bring this date forward and, as of Thursday 19 December 2019 - more than two weeks earlier than anticipated - all City recycling is being delivered to the SMRC recycling facility in Canning Vale.
