Historical Notes	In 1980, to commemorate the connection between the Benedictine monks and Subiaco's development, a grove of olive trees was planted, and the reserve named in honour of the bishop involved in the establishment of the monastery near Lake Monger.
Physical Description	The stone cairn and brass plaque is situated on the corner of the park area, and the grove of olive trees is to the east side. There is a timber bench in the centre. There is no fence
Associations	Dom Serra, Benedictine monk and Bishop – Namesake
Statement of Significance	The place has aesthetic and historic significance as a parkland reserve in Subiaco, and has social significance to the community as a place for social and recreational activities.
