Historical Notes	<p>Mueller was a botanist for the Colonial Government, and Mueller Road and Mueller Park were named in his honour. During WWI they were renamed Roberts Road and Kitchener Park respectively, after (non-German) war heroes. A section of Kitchener park was later renamed Mueller Park. Physical Description	<p>Large, grassed open space with mature trees, lights and benches scattered throughout. The area is fenced by low, pine barriers. There is a central, brick paved, terraced area and rotunda. A row of Port Jackson Fig Trees line Roberts Road. A row of trees runs diagonally from the north east to the south west corners.</p>
