Historical Notes	<p>Robinson Terrace was first identified in the Western Australian Post Office Directories in 1929, at which time it extended between Troy Terrace and what is now known as Olga Place. At that time 1 house had been completed, increasing to 3 in 1930 (originally listed as #s 7, 9 &amp; 11, but renumbered as 25, 27 &amp; 29 when the street was extended in 1936). Following the opening of the new Workers' Homes Board subdivision at the north-western end of Daglish, the construction of houses accelerated and by 1941 all but one of the residential sites along the southern side of street had been developed (bringing the total to 15). Along the northern side of the street, houses were built at 4, 6, 8 &amp; 10 (now known as 32, 34, 36 &amp; 38) in c.1936-1937. The remainder of the northern side of the street (which falls outside of the study area) was occupied as an industrial site.</p> <p>The last of the early residential sites (#21) was developed in the period c.1949 to 1953.</p>
