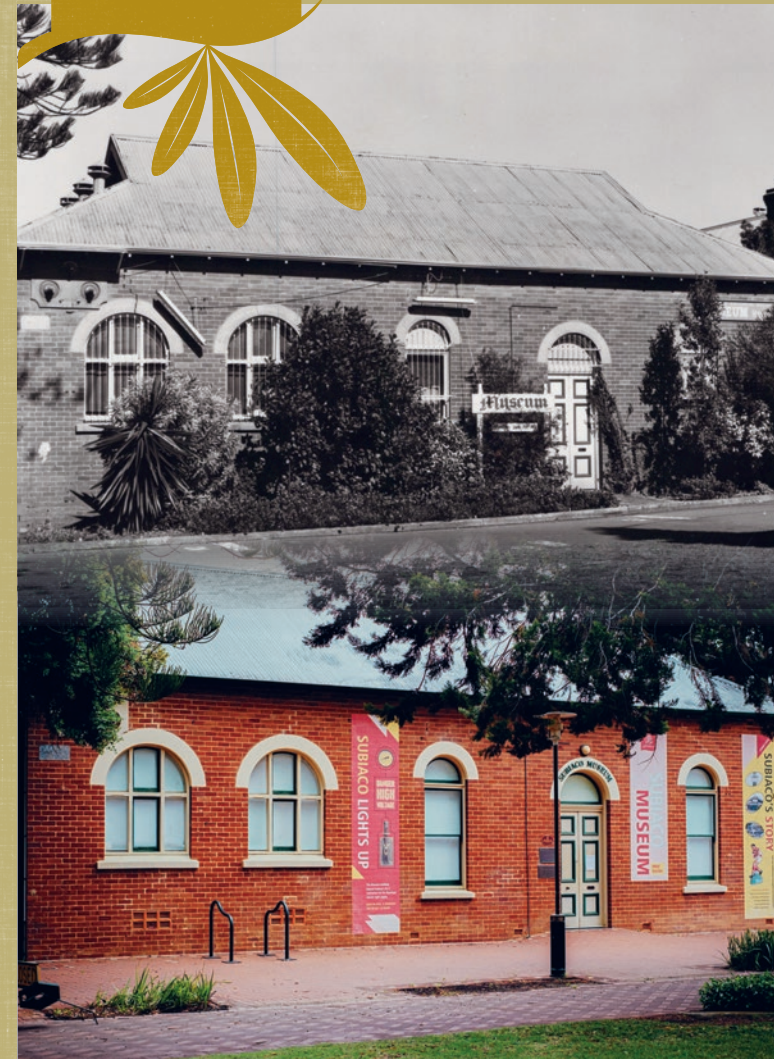

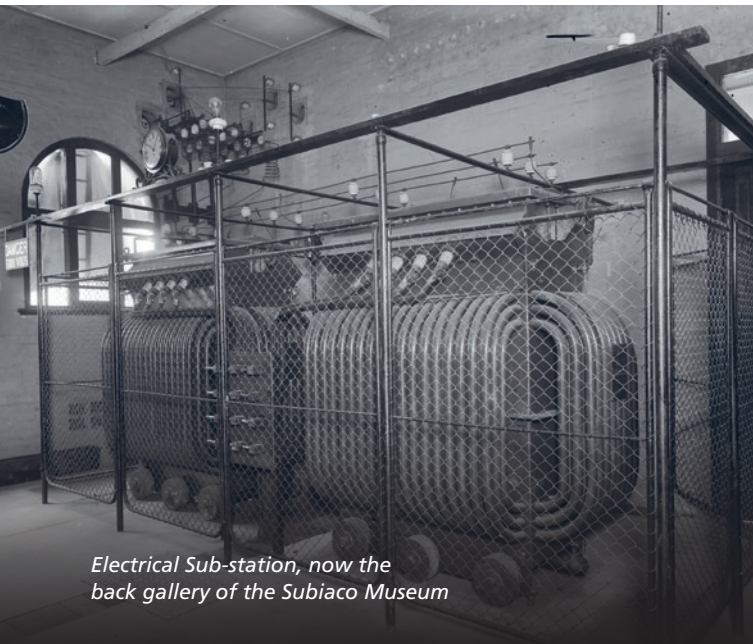
2025–2026 **free** guided walks exploring the history of the City of Subiaco

Meet at Mabel Talbot Park on Mother’s Day for a

moment of reflection, not only of the important role mothers have in our lives but also in civic development. Mabel Talbot was the first President of the Tree Society which planted many trees in this semi-permanent wetland, a wildlife sanctuary and breeding area, transforming it into a beautiful park.
