Their 2025 Ticketing Access Program will enable 100 young people and their families to attend the production of Hoods being held at the Subiaco Arts Centre in May 2025. They will receive complimentary tickets and vouchers to use at Subiaco businesses.	\$5,000

Subiaco Women's Shed	Seed Funding for the Subiaco Women's Shed Inaugural Year	The funding will enable the organisation to kick-start membership recruitment and training and provide a foundational base of equipment for events and activities for members in temporary spaces. The organisation will deliver pop-up sessions in Subiaco venues and parks (locations to be confirmed).	\$4,000
Curate Arts Inc.	Gurraway	Delivery of the Gurraway immersive art exhibition sessions in Subiaco by Koori Aboriginal artist, Tabatha Davison. Explores Aboriginal connection to Country and the impacts of past wrongs on the Stolen Generation. Exhibition will be delivered in November 2024.	\$2,500
Subicare Early Learning Centre	Electronic Whiteboard Educational Resource	This whiteboard will enhance learning and education opportunities for the young children (aged 0-5 years) attending the centre. Deserving Better WA	6-month Educational Project	Delivery of a six-month pilot project with a focus on empowering others, particularly those facing disadvantage, disenfranchisement, fear, trauma, and social isolation resulting from family and domestic violence, coercive control, racism, bullying, disability and discrimination. Consisting of three clinic days per week, plus monthly community seminars. Commencing July 2024 at The Third Place Community Centre in Subiaco.	\$2,500
Subiaco Playgroup (Subi Play Centre Inc.)	Subiaco Playgroup Development Project	Delivery of a Messy Play Day to stimulate discovery, deep thinking, and sensory and language recognition, and cultural workshops where children learn about different traditional festivals, languages, songs, calligraphy and food making.	\$1,500
