The new City of Subiaco Council met on Sunday 14 November to discuss their focus and priorities and plan a collaborative approach for the coming years.

Mayor David McMullen brought the new Council together for a full day of strategic thinking, planning and discussion, facilitated by consultant (and experienced CEO, Board Director and business leader) Ray Glickman.

Since the election, Councillors have been diligently working through a series of inductions and workshops, where they heard from the City's executive team, subject area specialists, and their longer serving Councillor colleagues who shared their experiences.

Mayor David McMullen said the planning day was an important exercise for the new-look Council. It was designed to inspire and motivate; cementing relationships and opening up the kinds of communications necessary for Council to govern and lead effectively.

### Little leaders learn about native bees

The Subi Kids Crew (SKC) donned their hats and took to the great outdoors recently for a special native bee workshop at Cliff Sadlier Reserve.

The group learnt about how they could help care for our native bees and the importance of insects when it comes to sustainability, with an opportunity to build their very own hotel for local bees.

SKC offers an opportunity for kids aged between 7 and 11 years to develop leadership, teamwork and communication skills in a fun and engaging way.

### New radars to tackle speeding

The City is tackling speeding on residential roads with the help of two new radars that alert drivers when they're over the speed limit.

The radars – which are portable – will be placed on Townshend Road, between Heystesbury and Hamersley roads, on Tuesday 30 November to address consistent speeding in this area.

Subiaco Mayor David McMullen said the radars were part of a trial while the City worked with Main Roads Western Australia to consider long-term speed reduction measures for speeding hotspots.

"These radars will serve as an interim measure to reduce speeding in targeted areas and will be rotated around the City to different speeding hotspots to slow motorists down and make them more aware of their behaviour and the impacts it can have," he said.
