At the City of Subiaco Ordinary Council Meeting held on 23 November 2021, Council proceeded with the following local planning policies. All policies can be downloaded from www.subiaco.wa.gov.au.

Local Planning Policy 8.3 'Percent for public art and public realm'

– introduces a requirement for developments in certain zones with a value of \$2 million and above to contribute one per cent of their development cost to public art or public realm upgrades within the City of Subiaco.

Local Planning Policy 8.2 - 'Advertisements (signs)'

 provides development control for advertisements (signs) including assessment and exemption criteria.

Local Planning Policy 7.3 'Public consultation for planning proposals' – provides guidance regarding public consultation for planning proposals.

Design Review Panel

The City is seeking expressions of interest for Design Review Panel membership for 2022-2024. The panel provides independent expert advice on development and planning proposals facilitating a high quality design of the built environment.
