The City is now running regular sessions to help you access and download your vaccination certificate, plus show you how to use the new ServiceWA app on your phone.

The ServiceWA app can be used to check-in to venues as well as show digital proof of your vaccination status.

The free drop-in sessions are on every weekday morning at Subiaco Library from 9.30am to 12pm.

You can drop-in and wait for assistance or you can book in a time by calling Subiaco Library on 9237 9300.

City requests protection of significant trees

The City has requested the State Government take a number of actions to protect three significant fig trees in the Subiaco East Redevelopment area, after a unanimous Council decision last month.

Recently approved design guidelines for the area suggest the possibility of the trees being relocated, but the City is concerned this would have a detrimental impact on the trees given the complex and intertwined root systems.

The City is currently seeking confirmation from the State Government around the following matters:

- The three fig trees (inclusive of their main root systems) will retain in situ.
- During subdivision works and construction of development on adjoining lots, the trees and their root systems will be protected and maintained.
- The trees will be situated in the public realm, as opposed to being incorporated into development lots in the area.

Special Council Meeting

A Special Council Meeting of the City of Subiaco will be held at 5pm on Tuesday 1 February 2022 in the Council Chambers, Administration Building (241 Rokeby Road, Subiaco).

The purpose of the meeting is to consider the Joint Development Assessment Panel development application for 263-277 Hay Street and 17-19 Olive Street, which proposes amendments to the current development approval.

Rokeby Road temporary partial closure update

There is a temporary partial closure of one lane (southbound) of Rokeby Road between Churchill Avenue and Roberts Road to enable the installation of an essential sewer upgrade to cater for One Subiaco and future developments in the area.

The partial closure is being done in stages to help minimise the impact.

Pedestrian access along both sides of Rokeby Road is remaining open at all times, as well as the northbound traffic and parking lane, and the intersection of Rokeby Road and Hay Street.

Water Corporation has determined the sewer upgrade is required to provide for the increase in residential and business activity now and into the future.
