Proof of vaccination now required at all City facilities

Subiaco Library is also introducing a new 'click and collect' service so everyone can continue to access library resources without needing to enter the building.

This new service will be offered every day between 9.30am and 5pm with Fridays now being exclusively 'click and collect' as the building will be closed due to staffing changes.
