Rokeby Road temporary partial closure

There will be a temporary partial closure of one lane (southbound) of Rokeby Road between Churchill Avenue and Roberts Road to enable the installation of an essential sewer upgrade to cater for One Subiaco and future developments in the area.

The partial closure will be done in stages, commencing on Tuesday 4 January 2022, and will also include works on Seddon Street.

Pedestrian access along both sides of Rokeby Road will remain open at all times, as well as the northbound traffic and parking lanes, and the Rokeby Road and Hay Street intersection.

Water Corporation has determined the sewer upgrade is required to provide for activity now and into the future.

The works are expected to take 10-12

year to remove feral carp and koi that are harmful to native fish.
