Updated report finds shortfall of sports space for future requirements

An updated report looking at the future requirements of sports space in the City has found the addition of Subiaco Oval as publicly available sports space is of significant benefit to the community but an overall shortfall still exists and is expected to worsen as the population of the City increases.

The report will be used to advocate for additional sports space going forward as well as government investment in sports facilities within the City.

It states that the addition of Subiaco Oval playing surface for use by community sporting clubs helps to reduce the existing shortfall and will ease pressure on Rosalie Park – the City’s current primary active sports space. However, it also identifies a shortfall which will only increase over time.

It recommends that the City continue efforts that have been made to date, to investigate opportunities for the shared use of school sports facilities outside of school hours.

Bin tagging program kicks off

A bin tagging education program is set to make it easier for residents to sort their recycling and reduce waste to landfill.

With several changes in recent years, navigating what belongs in recycling and general waste can be confusing, but bin tagging programs have seen great success in other WA local governments.

It involves a quick peep inside kerbside waste and recycling on bin day, with a tag then placed on bin handles providing helpful on-the-spot feedback for households.

The City of Subiaco’s bin tagging program will be run by the Western Metropolitan Regional Council and is set to kick off on 23 February and finish mid-April.

Heritage grants help revamp 1920s corner store

This year’s round of heritage grants is now open for City of Subiaco residents looking to preserve or renovate their heritage listed properties. Applications close **Monday 21 March**.

The grants of up to \$5000 provide funding for conservation works that are in public view and enhance and reveal the heritage significance of the property or to provide urgent conservation works required to stabilise a building.

One of last year’s grant recipients was Shelley Lewis. Shelley wanted to reinstate the bullnose verandah of 142 Hensman Road, Subiaco which was removed in the late 70s. The property was originally a corner store, circa 1922.

Nicholson Road Reserve Landscape Plan

Recent works to Nicholson Road Reserve have been completed including replacing sections of turf with ecozones and garden beds and adding native plants, creating a physical barrier along Thomas Road, and improved overall aesthetics.

Following community concerns after these works, the City appointed a landscape architect with heritage experience to provide a landscape plan for the whole site which addresses the biophysical, social and heritage elements of the reserve, including future planning for habitat restoration.
