WHO'S NEW IN SUBI

Summer saw a huge number of new venues open in the City of Subiaco and the momentum doesn't seem to be slowing down.

Golden West Brewery (pictured below) opened the doors to their very first brewery and bar on Hay Street, bringing a family-friendly vibe to the neighbourhood alongside their popular local craft beer.

The unique menu combines Australian and European favourites with south Asian spices, with a result that's nothing short of delicious



A stone's throw away from the new brewery, you'll find **Fresco Gelato** serving up creamy Italian gelato and Insta-worthy desserts that will have you wanting to order one of everything.



And as if Subiaco wasn't sweet enough, **La Maison des Eclairs** has opened a charming café on Railway Road specialising in, you guessed it, éclairs.

Neighbourhood favourite, **Dilly Dally**, has had a makeover with a new bar at the back (access via Rowland Street) and a redesigned main restaurant.

The delicious, comforting Italian fare and friendly service that Dilly Dally has become known for remains but **Bar Loiter** offers a more casual atmosphere in which to enjoy the same great food with an extended drinks offering including more cocktails, wine and beer on tap. You can even enjoy your drink with a side of sunshine (or stargazing) thanks to the beautiful sun deck area.

While not strictly new, a couple of well-loved local institutions have recently moved their home to Rokeby Road; **Piccolo Trattoria** (previously Shenton Park) has set up at 361 and **Delisio** (previously Churchill Avenue) can now be found at 175.

THE FUTURE IS GREEN

Caring for the environment and being sustainable are major priorities our community and therefore the City. In the last few months we've made some significant announcements to help keep the City's future green.

This year, the City will be moving to renewable energy across a number of sites, reducing emissions by an estimated 826 tonnes per year.

The Energy Sustainability and Renewables Project – coordinated by WALGA – supports local governments to achieve renewable energy and emission reduction targets, decrease offset reliance, and reduce costs.

The power-purchasing project aims to reduce the amount of energy derived from fossil fuels by using local renewable energy sources.

It will also help the City achieve ambitious carbon reduction targets which include moving to 100 per cent renewable energy by 2025 and reducing operational greenhouse gas emissions by 45 per cent by 2030.

Last year, the City announced it was the first WA local government to be certified carbon neutral under the Commonwealth's Climate Active program; you can read more about this exciting milestone at www.subiaco.wa.gov.au.

Other recent green projects include:

- o a joint greening plan for the western suburbs to manage, protect, preserve and enhance vegetation in parks, reserves and private land
- o two additional floating islands in Subiaco Common Lake to naturally improve water quality and reduce the risk of algae blooms, as well as providing a safe haven for wildlife.

City staff are experts in many fields, working hard for the benefit of your community. We asked them to share their tips with you. This edition's tip comes from our Climate Change Officer who lives and breathes sustainability...

Plant local native species in your garden. Not only does this create habitat for fauna and encourage biodiversity, it will save on watering and the need for fertiliser! Autumn is the perfect time to plant natives as the weather is cooling down and we start getting more rain. If you haven't got much space, consider supporting an organisation like Carbon Positive who undertake revegetation projects throughout Australia.

NEW BULK WASTE COLLECTION

SFRVICE PROVES SUCCESS

The City's bespoke new bulk waste pick up service, Verge ValetTM, has been running on a trial basis for several months now and is proving to be successful.

Under the new service, residents choose when their bulk waste gets collected rather than waiting for the previously bi-annual collection on specific set dates.

It aims to reduce waste to landfill, increase recycling and create a more circular economy.

Many residents have said how easy and convenient Verge ValetTM is.

"Everything ran like clockwork. After submitting the online request I was called within a short timeframe and the lady was so friendly and helpful," said one resident.

Another said: "Prompt service. So great to put out the rubbish the night before knowing it was to be removed the next day. Thank you."

NEW COMMUNITY SPORTING FACILITY UP AND RUNNING

The new community mixed use facility at Rosalie Park is now up and running. It replaces the old cricket nets and scoreboard, with the design informed by community consultation.

It features:

- tennis half-court with hit-up wall and lacrosse goal markings
- full size netball and basketball hardcourt
- two new cricket nets
- shed
- community garden/ orchard
- new landscaping to the embankment
- new park benches
- concrete kerb
- outdoor ping pong table as well as new tree planting and space for future additions.







ASKING OUR COMMUNITY

Community engagement is an important part of the projects the City invests in. In recent months there have been several major projects that we've asked for your input into, the resulting projects will soon be delivered in your town centre.

Seddon Street transformation

This project will see Seddon Street (pictured above) transformed into a pedestrian-friendly shared space becoming a vibrant new place for the community. The upgrade will address the broader precinct, connect key parts of the town centre and provide a welcoming meeting place for the community. It's due to be complete by the end of the year.





SubiPOP (Public Open Places) Public Realm upgrades

Postal Walk, Forrest Walk and the newly named Station Walk are set to become welcoming meeting places for the

community, creating new places for people to connect and allowing the City to better deliver programs and events. The upgrade – which will kick off shortly in Postal Walk

– will also connect key locations along Rokeby Road.

HOW TO GET THE LATEST


