Subiaco Museum marked International Women's Day this week with a series of events and exhibits highlighting the roles women have played in Subiaco's rich history.

Taking centre stage is the new feature page (Objects of the month) on the City's website that profiles some of the key female figures in Subiaco's history, including Mrs Ethel Maude Thomas M.B.E who formed the Subiaco Red Cross Voluntary Aid Detachment No 503 in 1933.

The team have also been busy cataloguing and photographing more than 200 artworks for the museum's new online collection via CollectionsWA.
