Native plant subsidy scheme

The City has extended its native plant subsidy scheme (run in partnership with WESROC) into June. Ratepayers can buy up to 80 local native plants for their verge and garden at the subsidised cost of \$1.75 each. As well as enhancing and supporting local biodiversity, native plants require little water or fertiliser once they're established. APACE Nursery (open Monday to Friday) in North Fremantle is facilitating the scheme. Proof of residency is required. For more, visit www.apacewa.org.au or www.subiaco.wa.gov.au/news.

Restoration project gets green light

Subiaco Library is set to be restored to its former glory and preserved for generations to come after Council gave the green light to a new project.

Subiaco Library (E H Parker Library) is a landmark building in Subiaco but past landscape and design choices coupled with rising damp has resulted in a decline in the condition of the exterior of the building.

The new project will restore, remediate and ultimately enhance the exterior of this important building that forms part of the City's Local Heritage Register.

Plastic Free July coming up

The City will investigate opportunities to reduce single-use plastics and increase recycling in its day-to-day operations, after a decision made by Council on Tuesday evening.

The Elected Members' Motion flagged the opportunity as Plastic Free July approaches, noting that reducing the City's use of single-use plastics is an action in its Waste Plan 2020-2025.

Proposed scheme amendment

Council have resolved not to adopt a proposed amendment to Local Planning Scheme No. 5 (LPS 5) regarding a change in density within the street block bound by Waylen Road, Railway Road, Morgan Street and Fortune Street.

The City recently received the request from a landowner for a proposed increased in density to a number of lots in this block.

Council deemed the proposed amendment was not consistent with a local planning strategy for the scheme that has been endorsed by the Western Australian Planning Commission.

New Waste Local Law endorsed

At its meeting this week, Council endorsed the Waste Local Law 2022. This new law was required as the City is currently using the refuse provisions of the City's Health Local Law, which will be repealed when the *Public Health Act 2016* comes into effect on 1 July 2022.

The new local law will assist the City in administering sustainable waste and recycling services to maintain consistent, cost effective and functional refuse management practices to aid in the reduction of waste to landfill.

Residents and businesses will not notice any change to their waste collection services as a result of the new local law.

Heritage grants

The City appreciates the dedication of home owners who work to conserve and enhance their heritage properties, and, in turn, the beautiful heritage of our suburbs.

Council recently awarded two grants for works to heritage properties. One grant was awarded towards repairing and/or acid cleaning the original stained glass windows of a property on Nicholson Road, and the second towards reinstating timber sash windows to the first floor façade of a building on Hay Street.

The grants provide financial assistance to property owners for works in the public view that conserve or enhance the heritage significance of an area, and for works required to stabilise a building.
