

Polyphagous shot-hole borer beetle

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) is responding to the confirmed detection of an exotic beetle, the Polyphagous Shot-Hole Borer (PSHB) in the Perth metropolitan area. The establishment of this pest in WA may have a significant impact on urban trees, native trees and certain industries.

The City of Subiaco has not identified or been informed by DPIRD of any positive sighting of the shot-hole borer within the City, however, DPIRD are monitoring the area and you may see staff carrying out inspections in parks and on your verge. You may also see signs posted around parks and trees that have been inspected. The latest information can be found at www.agric.wa.gov.au/borer.

Rokeby Road Planter Boxes

The planter boxes in the Rokeby Road median strip have been wrapped in historic photographs of the City of Subiaco. This is part of a four-month trial to upgrade the streetscape by reskinning the existing planter boxes. At the August Council Meeting, Council decided to extend the trial to reskin additional planter boxes along Rokeby Road. This is a temporary solution to upgrade the visual aesthetic of the town, additional treatment to the median strip is still being discussed, and your input is welcome.

The City is seeking your feedback on the treatment of all of the newly skinned planter boxes through an online survey. The survey closes 5pm Monday 21 November.
