After a fire damaged the building at 241 Rokeby Road in September 2022, Council meetings have been held at a variety of locations and staff have been working across multiple City facilities and from home.

The City of Subiaco has now secured a four-year lease of new premises in the heart of Subiaco at 388 Hay Street. As well as being in close proximity to Subiaco train station and major transport routes, the building is serviced by a 75-bay public car park, and convenient street parking.

While the offices are being fitted out and the staff are settling in, the community is asked to check the City's website for regular updates on Council meeting times and venues, and for all your customer service needs.





The City of Subiaco is always looking for ways to improve, particularly when it comes to sustainable initiatives. To carry out its services to our community, the City has a fleet of 93 vehicles, which includes everything from electric pool cars through to 26-tonne waste trucks.

When the City was looking for a tracking system to help manage the fleet and maintain our carbon neutral certification, the EROAD platform was selected following a tender process.

The EROAD platform does more than just allow for real-time vehicle tracking and data for measuring carbon emissions; it also provides tools to improve driver behaviour and video evidence in the event of incidents.

"This cost-effective technology has significantly improved driver behaviour, and has provided an efficient way to monitor and reduce emissions across the City's vehicle fleet by optimising vehicle routes and therefore fuel consumption. This is important, as reducing carbon emissions is a key focus for the Council." ~ Mayor David McMullen

The City of Subiaco is at the forefront of sustainability and was the first certified carbon neutral local government in Western Australia under the Commonwealth's Climate Active program.

FOGO IS COMING, HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

FOGO (Food Organics Garden Organics) bins are coming to the City of Subiaco in May 2023. FOGO bins will turn your food scraps and garden organics into compost, and they couldn't be easier to use. Good news for you and good news for the planet!

FOGO will be easy for you to use from the start. When you're good to FOGO, you will be able to place all your food scraps and garden waste into your new lime green-lidded bin.

We will also deliver a kitchen caddy, two rolls of compostable caddy liners and an information pack to your house, to make it easy for you to sort your food waste from your general waste.

Once collected, waste from FOGO bins is made into high-quality compost that can be distributed amongst parks and gardens.
This process means less waste is sent to landfill, and fewer greenhouse gases are produced.

FOGO DOS AND DON'TS

Here's a quick guide to what you should be putting in each bin once the FOGO system officially begins.







BULK GREEN WASTE

COLLECTION IN JUNE

You can put all of your green waste in your new FOGO bin with your food scraps for collection weekly. The City will also provide two additional bulk green waste collections during the year.

Next Bulk Green Waste Collection: Commencing The next bulk green waste collection is scheduled to commence on Monday 19 June 2023; please place any loose green waste out by the evening of Sunday 18 June. There is no limit to the quantity of green waste that you can put out, but please keep clippings loose and do not place in green waste bags.





STAFF EXPERT TIP

This edition's expert tip comes from our Manager Waste and Infrastructure Maintenance, who has some great ideas when thinking about ways to reuse and recycle.

Flattened, clean cardboard boxes, paper (not shredded), and clean, empty plastic and glass containers and bottles can all be recycled through your yellow-lidded bin loose, rinsed and lids off, please!

Buy Nothing Facebook groups are very popular as they encourage reuse of goods and contribute to a circular economy. To find a Buy Nothing group in your area, Google your suburb name plus 'Buy Nothing'.

The West Metro Recycling Centre in Shenton Park is the place to go to recycle all sorts of things some free and some for a fee. Check their website for details: wmrc.wa.gov.au.

Remember you can choose when your general bulk waste gets collected via Verge Valet™. Residents are eligible for two Verge Valet™ collections per annum.

CONTAINERS FOR CHANGE EXCHANGE

Containers for Change recycles eligible drink containers. Some City bins now have Container Exchange points attached to make it easier for you to participate in the scheme. 10¢ containers placed in the Container Exchange points are then available for anyone in the community to collect and return to a Containers for Change refund point.

Alternatively, you can drop eligible drink containers off at Lords Recreation Centre and help raise money for our resident clubs! The sports club receiving the Containers for Change proceeds changes every month, benefitting our community.

NEW PARKING OPTION IN DOWNTOWN SUBI

A new 136-bay car park has opened at 10 Rokeby Road. The City worked with property owners Blackburne to make the basement car park at ONE Subiaco available as public parking.

The car park contains 136 parking bays made up of 109 standard bays, two ACROD bays and 24 motorcycle bays. There is also one electric vehicle charging station available.

Parking is free for the first hour, then is \$2.50 per hour (maximum \$15.00 per day) from 8am to 6pm, Monday to Friday. Cheaper rates apply after 6pm on weekdays, and on weekends.


