## MERRY MOMENTS THIS FESTIVE SEASON

Subiaco will undergo a festive makeover with a series of weekly Christmas-themed activities on Friday afternoons from now until Friday 16 December.

Activities will include visits from Santa and his elves, Christmas carols and other live entertainment, and a visit from the Freedom Fairies for face painting and other kids' activities.

The suburb will be adorned in Christmas decorations, including an impressive 13-metre-tall Christmas tree at Forrest Walk, a Christmas cockatoo at Postal Walk, and a glowing installation on the corner of Hay Street and Rokeby Road.

Local businesses are also planning a range of festive events throughout December, including wreath-making workshops, Christmas-themed paint and sip classes, candle making classes, bauble painting sessions and much more.



## EXCITING NEW VENUES

The last few months have seen some very exciting venues from renowned Perth restaurateurs pop up right in here in Subi. We've also welcomed a few unique retailers – here's all you need to know about Subiaco's newest offerings.

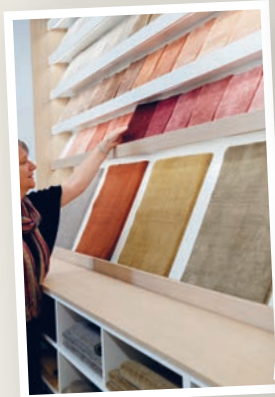
Serving up 'Tulum-meets-SoCal Mexican' cuisine, notable restaurateur Clint Nolan's **La Condesa** (pictured below) officially opened its doors on Hay Street in late September. If you don't know Clint by name, you'll definitely know of his other Perth venues; Henry Summer, La Cholita, and Toots, to name a few.

On the menu you'll find seasonal fruit cocktails, a variety of delicious tacos and plenty of locally sourced seafood. Inside, you'll find a modern, resort-inspired interior with a quirky bar that displays its 160-bottle tequila collection.



Just down the street you'll find **Lums Wine Bar** (pictured below) at 433 Hay Street. Owned by the team behind Bark, also on Hay Street, the bar's name is a nod to its predecessors Emily and Charles Lums, who owned the EA Lums Grocery & General Store in the 1920s.

The cosy bar, which opened in August, offers a range of quality, artisan wines, and a share-style food menu with items like charcuterie boards and tapas.



If you're hunting for home goods, **The Rug Establishment** (pictured above) opened their latest luxury rug showroom on Hay Street in September. Here you'll find a collection of quality handcrafted rugs, and plenty of custom rug options.

Up on Station Street, newcomer **Quinn Eyeworks** offers a curated gallery of the world's leading eyewear designs. Stop in to browse their collection, including some limited-edition pieces.

One of Subiaco's newest arrivals is **Koba** (pictured below), an Asian fusion restaurant located at 71 Rokeby Road. Its owner, Paul Truong, also operates the popular U&I café in Northbridge, famed for its pho which is available 24/7.

Koba is open seven days a week, from 10am to midnight, and is serving up a range of delicious dishes including umami fries, flaming prawns, bao sliders and matcha soba noodles. Their signature cocktail list is also worth a try, featuring a 'foggy negroni' and Japanese margarita.



## COMING SOON: ONE SUBIACO

ONE Subiaco residents will start to move in in December, and a few short months after, some brand-new eateries and a supermarket will open on the building's ground floor.

Miles Hull, the hospitality whiz behind Little Creatures, will open Subiaco Continental in March 2023. It will offer a European-inspired bar and eating house with alfresco areas, an open kitchen, and all-day food service.

Stay tuned, as a number of other exciting businesses will also be calling ONE Subiaco home in early 2023.

## AIRPORT LINE CUTS TRAVEL TIME

The METRONET Airport Line launched in October making it easier than ever to travel to and from Subiaco.



The service runs through Subiaco on the Fremantle train line, which means trains stop every six minutes at Subiaco, Daglish, Shenton Park and West Leederville stations during peak times. The service will enable people coming from locations like High Wycombe, Bayswater and East Perth to access Subiaco via train in mere minutes, with no transfer at the Perth CBD station.

Subiaco residents travelling to the airport will also benefit from this service, as the journey time from Subiaco station to Airport Central is now just 27 minutes.



## TIM WINTON AWARD WINNERS

Sixteen young writers were awarded for their entries in the state-wide Tim Winton Award for Young Writers, which is in its thirtieth year. This year, the City received more than 1300 entries, with regional entries from as far as Karratha, Broome, Geraldton and Albany.

## GIANT ARRIVES IN SUBIACO

Have you heard? A beautiful wooden Giant has been spotted right here in Subiaco!

The Giant, named Bille Bob, is part of an Australian-first exhibition by world-renowned Danish artist Thomas Dambo called the Giants of Mandurah.

The exhibition features a number of Dambo's whimsical wooden creatures installed in secret locations throughout the City of Mandurah, plus one in Subiaco, who is a little lost, for visitors to discover with the help of a trail map.

## READING INTO SUSTAINABILITY

To help better understand the building's energy consumption and rooftop solar performance, devices called WattWatchers have been installed at Subiaco Library.

This special sustainability project is designed to improve energy monitoring processes, and precedes the Subiaco Library Renovation project, which is set to remediate and restore external elements of the building, including lighting, brickwork and landscaping.

## ARE YOU READY TO FOGO?

Subiaco is set to shift to a 240L Food Organics, Garden Organics (FOGO) waste service in winter 2023.

This new service will introduce a three-bin system for City of Subiaco residents; a red-lidded general waste bin, yellow-lidded recycling bin, and a lime green-lidded bin for food scraps and garden vegetation. You'll receive a small kitchen caddy bin (and liners) to hold food scraps until they are tipped into your large FOGO bin.

Once your FOGO bin is collected, it will travel to a special processor that will convert your food and garden organics into high quality compost, which will then be distributed to parks and gardens across the City. The more food and garden waste that is saved from landfill, the less greenhouse gases are produced.

The Lords crèche looks after kids from eight weeks to six years of age, and provides a range of pricing and timing options to ensure you can have flexibility in your workout schedule.

The crèche allows up to two hours of access, and its experienced staff are committed to providing your children with the highest possible level of care and attention.

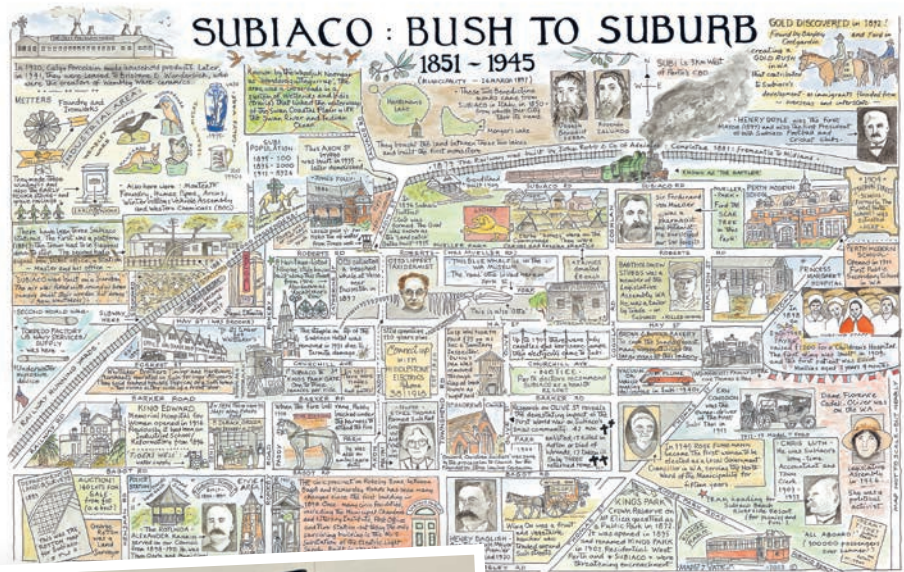


## HERITAGE MAP UNVEILED AT SUBIACO MUSEUM

A beautifully detailed heritage map, entitled 'Subiaco: Bush to Suburb, 1851-1945', is the centrepiece of a new exhibition at Subiaco Museum.

The map was created by local artist Mary Yates, who is renowned for her unique pictorial maps that reveal incredible historical detail. This map, in particular, explores the history and heritage of Subiaco following colonial settlement of the area.

The map took many months to create, and is completely hand-drawn, featuring a number of beautiful watercolour illustrations. It is currently on display at the museum as part of the Heritage Map Exhibition.

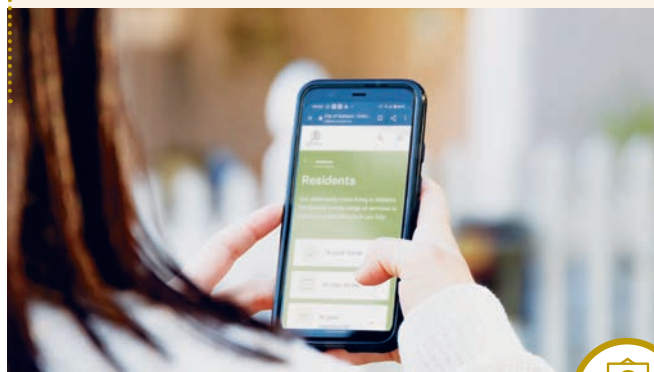
