Bushfire season

The City of Subiaco's fire season runs from 1 November 2022 to 31 March 2023, which means it's time to ensure your home doesn't present a fire hazard.

Vegetation can become significantly dry during this period, increasing the threat of fire so please ensure vegetation and gardens are managed so that grass is no greater than five centimetres in length, trees and shrubs near structures are appropriately pruned, and roofs and gutters are free of flammable material.

The burning of garden refuse is strictly prohibited within the City of Subiaco. Under the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, significant penalties apply for failing to comply with these requirements. If you have any queries, please call **9237 9222**.

Drainage upgrade works

Drainage upgrade works will affect some laneway access this November. From Monday 7 November until Sunday 13 November, there will be limited access to the laneway 470 off Coghlan Road between Hay Street and Churchill Avenue. From Thursday 10 November, there will be full closure to the laneway 471 off Churchill Avenue east of Coghlan Road for 21 days. There will be a lane closure on Churchill Avenue starting on Wednesday 16 November and expected to take approximately 10 working days. During this time, residents can use ROW 472 off Churchill Avenue west of Thomas Street to access ROW 470.
