International Day of People with Disability (IDPwD) aims to increase public awareness, understanding, and acceptance of people with disability, and to celebrate their contributions and achievements. To recognise this important day, the City is supporting a number of events.

On Friday 2 December at 10am, Rebound WA will run a wheelchair basketball session at Lords Recreation Centre. Members of the community are invited to reserve a spot in this free session.

Also at Lords on the same day, Mark Elsing will be trying to complete his 'Mission Impossible' by 'travelling' 65km using an upper body ergometer while fundraising for a good cause, so drop by to cheer him along.

The City has also partnered with Mission Australia to deliver the 'Nothing About Us, Without Us' exhibition at Subiaco Arts Centre, which aims to build meaningful partnerships with local artists living with disability. You can reserve your spot at the launch taking place at 2pm on Saturday 3 December, and the exhibition will be open every day from 9am to 5pm until Saturday 10 December.

First SubiPOP public space contract awarded

The first of the SubiPOP (Public Open Places) public realm upgrades will commence in early 2023, after Council awarded the construction contract for Postal Walk at its meeting on 22 November 2022.

Postal Walk is the first component of initiatives being undertaken to improve the public realm in and around Rokeby Road. Improvements include a large deck to protect the root system of the extant Ghost Gum, re-treatment of existing planter boxes, installation of new garden beds, new lighting and replacement paving.

The project is funded through the City's capital works budget, with supplementary funding from RAC's Reconnect WA initiative which aims to create vibrant streets and public spaces for Western Australians to interact and connect with each other.

In what is believed to be a WA local government first, the City is considering cutting development application fees in a bid to increase engagement and conversation between applicants and their neighbours. This would incentivise developers to consult with their neighbours prior to lodging a development application with the City and could help avoid potential issues.

Early engagement is also likely to speed up the development application process, avoid surprises for people who may be directly affected by development and, ultimately, result in better outcomes for the developer and community.
