#### Draft amended Local Planning Policy 7.2 – Refunding, Reducing and Waiving Planning Fees

The City of Subiaco is inviting public comment on draft Local Planning Policy 7.2 – Refunding, Reducing and Waiving Planning Fees (LPP 7.2), which introduces a new pre-lodgement public consultation concession. Applicants who consult with their neighbours prior to lodgement of their development plans may be eligible for a 25 per cent reduction of their development application fees.

## Bulk green waste verge collection

There will be a bulk green waste verge collection commencing Monday 16 January; please place any loose green waste out by the evening of Sunday 15 January. There is no limit to the quantity of green waste that you can put out, but please do not place in green waste bags.

Green waste bags will continue to be collected as usual from Monday 23 January until the City's new Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) waste system is rolled out later this year.

Once FOGO is in place, residents will be able to put nearly all organic waste in their new FOGO bin collected weekly. Additional waste will be removed during two bulk green waste collection weeks per year; the next one is scheduled for 19 June 2023.

### Fight the bite

Residents and businesses are being encouraged to reduce instances of stagnant water over the next couple of months, to help prevent summer mosquito breeding. Please check, and regularly change, water in ponds, bird baths and pot plant bases.

Make sure you're protected from mosquito bites by wearing long, loosefitting, light coloured clothing and applying insect repellent containing DEET or picaridin to exposed skin.
