Earthwise is a not-for-profit organisation that supports disadvantaged people through the provision of nutritious food, low-cost clothing, and homeware items. This includes a volunteer-run op-shop, a permaculture garden system, regular music nights, a Thursday community lunch, and heavily discounted food supplied by Food Bank. People can also contribute to community life through gardening, cooking, creating art, and socialising with others.

The Subiaco Community Men's Shed helps men to connect with others, and participate in meaningful activities that contribute to the community and their own wellbeing. It is a place where men can express themselves creatively through woodworking and metalworking activities.
