The City is inviting public comment on a proposal to modify the Rokeby Road and Hay Street Heritage Area and amend the related Local Planning Policy 3.6 Development guidelines for the Rokeby Road and Hay Street Heritage Area (LPP 3.6).

This Heritage Area covers Rokeby Road from Roberts Road to Bagot Road, and Hay Street from Rokeby Road to the vicinity of Catherine Street.
