Local Planning Policy 7.7

The City of Subiaco is inviting public comment on a proposal to amend Local Planning Policy 7.7: Development Approval Exemptions (LPP 7.7).

The recommended policy amendments are:

- Update outdated references to legislation and policy.
- Make minor amendments to definitions and restructuring of policy format.
- Update existing provisions to ensure they remove ambiguity, align with other planning instruments and expand on certain exemptions where there is low risk of amenity impacts.
- Inclusion of a new Table 2 with provisions relating to exempting temporary events managed by the City.

Work on the City's Postal Walk upgrade project is due to start on Monday 22 May. The project will provide additional space for the community to sit and connect.

Works will include new lighting, public artworks and the installation of new decking designed to protect the root system of the existing Flooded Gum tree.

All businesses in the area will remain open for trade during construction. We appreciate your patience and cooperation during the construction period.

FOGO bin collection starts Monday 22 May

Subiaco's FOGO collection officially begins next week. City residents in single-unit dwellings should now have received a 240L lime green-lidded FOGO bin, with a small FOGO kitchen caddy and two rolls of compostable caddy liners inside.

From next week, your bin collections will not change, but the combination of bins that you put out will change. Your FOGO bin will be collected every week, and your general waste and recycling bins will be collected on alternating weeks.

Remember, only food waste, garden waste, paper products, and compostable caddy liners can go into your 240L FOGO bin.
