

Council firm on opposing proposed Improvement Plan

At its final meeting to be held at the City's former Administration Centre, Council voted to make sections of a confidential report public to enable greater transparency on a proposed Improvement Plan at 450 Hay Street.

The report considered the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage's request to consider information from property owner, Sanur, relating to the proposed Improvement Plan, which seeks to acquire City-owned Burley Lane (freehold land owned by the City).

It is understood the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) have now received a request from Sanur to consider additional information which proposes to establish a framework for the WAPC to acquire Burley Lane. This would facilitate Sanur's redevelopment of the site. The City has raised a number of concerns with the proposed plan.

Mayor David McMullen said, "The City has firmly opposed the Improvement Plan at one WAPC meeting already, and will continue to do so off the back of Council's resolution this week. We hope the matter will be rejected once and for all at the WAPC's June meeting.

"In parallel with efforts to resist the Improvement Plan at WAPC level, the City will also continue to explore whether an outcome can be negotiated with Sanur directly that meets all parties' main objectives.'
