## Finalisation of Local Planning Policy 7.2

At the City of Subiaco Ordinary Council Meeting held on Tuesday 30 May 2023, Council proceeded with amended Local Planning Policy 7.2 – Refunding, Reducing and Waiving Planning Fees (LPP 7.2).

The policy introduces a new pre-lodgement public consultation concession. Applicants who consult with their neighbours prior to lodgement of their development plans for standard development applications, and meet all the criteria in LPP 7.2, are eligible for a 25 per cent reduction of their development application fees.
