Rates increase kept to a low 1.9 per cent

Council endorsed the 2023–24 budget at its meeting on 27 June, approving a rate rise of 1.9 per cent. This is the same increase as last year and there is no increase to the minimum rate, which has remained at \$1190.

Capital works highlights from this year's budget include the commencement of streetscape upgrades to Rokeby Road South, and the drainage program will continue at Hay Street, Subiaco Square and other locations.

A key feature of the budget is a newly approved digital transformation project to transform the City's legacy systems and processes, bringing about improvements in service delivery for customers and the community.
