



The City of Subiaco is leading the way with industry highs in 17 areas, and an 87 per cent positive rating as a governing organisation, in the latest Community Scorecard results.

The independent scorecard survey is conducted annually using an external consultancy to evaluate community priorities, gain important community feedback and insight, and measure performance against key indicators, with results benchmarked against other WA local governments.

Industry highs this year – as scored by the community – include Subiaco Library; tree management; festivals, events, arts and cultural activities; local roads; recognition of cultural diversity; and support for local businesses.

As a place to live, survey respondents gave a 99 per cent positive rating.

Mayor David McMullen said these results were hard-earned recognition for the dedication of both Elected Members and City administration staff.

“The City came out as the third top local government authority for overall performance which is a huge achievement. It’s not a competition, but I do think it’s appropriate we acknowledge the group effort that has resulted in our ‘podium finish’.”
