New partnership to save local turtles

The City of Subiaco has committed to helping to save the threatened snake-neck turtle through a new partnership.

Many of the City's wetlands, including Mabel Talbot and Lake Jualbup, are home to snake-neck turtles but local populations are increasingly under threat due to predators, road fatalities, and diminishing nesting habitats.

A collaboration with Murdoch University and the South West Metropolitan Alliance will see the City participate in a citizen science program aiming to conserve and protect remaining populations.

The community will be able to learn about this threatened species and contribute important data using a smartphone app which can be used to inform future management plans.

It's all kicking off with a free information night on Wednesday 13 September at Palms Community Centre from 6pm until 7pm.

Rate notices now out

City of Subiaco ratepayers will have started receiving their rate notices by email or post.

Mayor David McMullen said, "We know everyone faces different economic pressures and nobody likes getting their annual rate notice, but the good news is that in the City of Subiaco this year's rates increase has been kept at a low 1.9%.

"This is equal to last year; and it follows two previous years of 0%. There is no increase to the minimum rate, which is the fifth year in a row at this price."
