It was planted in about 1967 by the community-sponsored Senior Citizen's Club.

Inclusion on the register means that a development application must be submitted should the removal of the tree ever be proposed.

Finalisation of Local Planning Policy

Local Planning Policy 3.6 - Development guidelines for the Rokeby Road and Hay Street Heritage Area

At the City of Subiaco Ordinary Council Meeting held on 29 August 2023, Council proceeded with amendments to Local Planning Policy 3.6 - Development Guidelines for the Rokeby Road and Hay Street

The policy outlines the boundaries of the heritage area, identifies which places contribute to the heritage significance of the area and provides guidance on development to conserve the cultural heritage significance of the area. Key amendments to the policy include the identification of laneways as elements that contribute to the heritage values of the area and changes to the levels of contribution some properties make to the heritage significance of the area.
