Vacant Council seats elected unopposed

There will be no election in the City of Subiaco this year after all six vacant seats were elected unopposed last week at the close of the nomination period.

Rosemarie De Vries will serve on Council once again and is joined in the north ward by Russell Jones. Penny O'Connor and Nicola Johnston will represent the central ward, and the two vacant seats in the east and south wards will be filled by returning Elected Members Mark Burns and Rick Powell respectively.

The new Elected Members will be sworn in on Tuesday 24 October, when the Deputy Mayor will also be elected.

Mayor David McMullen said he looked forward to seeing out the remainder of the term with the current Council and working with the new Council come late October.

"As a Council, we've achieved an enormous amount over the last two years and I'm incredibly proud of everyone's efforts and dedication to making the City of Subiaco the best it can be for our residents, business community and visitors," he said.

"I thank outgoing elected members Stephanie Stroud, Angela Hamersley, and Lynette Jennings for their service over the past years."

Supporting vulnerable community members

The City is taking action to assist people at risk of, or those currently experiencing, homelessness by engaging The Salvation Army to deliver a walk-in centre every Wednesday at The Third Place.

The centre will assess the needs of clients, providing information, food, water, clothing, and sleeping bags as well as referrals to appropriate services including exploring accommodation options.

City of Subiaco Mayor David McMullen said, "The centre will provide a coordinated response to homelessness and help some of the most vulnerable members of our community. It offers the complex care required to make a meaningful difference to the lives of people who are at risk of, or who are experiencing homelessness in the community."

The Salvation Army have a referral number for anyone in the City who wants to help someone experiencing homelessness (0429 511 833), and also operate an evening outreach service.

Temporary library closure and pop-up library coming

Subiaco Library will be closed for restorations from 23 September, and a pop-up library will open on Monday 2 October.

The works come after past landscape and design choices, coupled with rising damp, have resulted in a decline in the condition

of the exterior of this landmark building that is on the City's Local Heritage Register.

The library may be closed for up to six months. The pop-up library will be in parts of 241 Rokeby Road (adjacent to Subiaco Library). A large selection from the usual collection will be available, as well as a dedicated children's library, ample seating with magazines and papers, a bookable meeting room similar to the Nook, and study spaces.

Opening hours and regular programming will remain unchanged and e-resources will be still be available to library members 24/7.

Finalisation of Local Planning Policy 7.7

Development Approval Exemptions

At the City of Subiaco Ordinary Council Meeting held on 29 August 2023, Council proceeded with amended Local Planning Policy 7.7 – Development Approval Exemptions (LPP 7.7).

The key amendments to the currently adopted LPP 7.7 are:

- General and administrative amendments;
- Definition amendments;
- Exemption amendments; and
- New exemptions, including City managed events.
