The City is supporting a weekly night market at Market Square Park this summer, bringing curated food and drink offerings, live music and pre-loved fashion together under the setting sun.

### Minute with the Mayor

A quick monthly update from Mayor David McMullen

Another week, and more Subiaco good news stories. They show no sign of slowing.

From November, the Saturday night markets will complement other existing, and trial concept, markets in Subiaco. A continuation of our market heritage, for which Subiaco is still widely known.

### Fire season

With fire season in the City almost here (1 November 2023 to 31 March 2024), it's time to ensure your home doesn't present a fire hazard.

Vegetation can become significantly dry during this period, exacerbating the threat of fire, so it's important to ensure vegetation and gardens are managed.

Grass should be no greater than 5cm in length, trees and shrubs near structures should be appropriately pruned, and roofs and gutters need to be free of flammable material.

The burning of garden refuse is strictly prohibited within the City of Subiaco.

Under the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, the penalty for failing to comply with these requirements may be a fine of up to \$5000. Infringements may also be issued.
