Residential e-permit parking

Residential e-permits are almost here to replace paper permits and provide a quicker solution for parking in the City.

The new online system will allow residents to apply for parking permits in just a couple of steps, with permits instantly valid from the time they're approved.

E-permits are better for the environment, can't be lost or stolen, and puts you in charge.

Call for nominations – Daglish Local Heritage Survey

The City is inviting nominations for places in Daglish to be included on the Local Heritage Survey. The Daglish Precinct is the triangular section of land bounded by the railway reserve, Hay Street, Selby Street and Lonnie Street.

The Local Heritage Survey (LHS) is an information resource that provides the City with a cultural and historical record of the area and tells the story of the development of the district. Places of heritage value such as buildings, heritage streetscapes, gardens, man-made parks and trees can be nominated for inclusion on the LHS. Nominations close on Monday 4 December.

Finalisation of Local Planning Policy

Local Planning Policy 1.3 – Sustainable Development

At the City of Subiaco Ordinary Council Meeting held on 31 October 2023, Council proceeded with Local Planning Policy 1.3 – Sustainable Development (LPP 1.3).

LPP 1.3 requires all new single houses, grouped dwellings, and significant alterations/additions to consider sustainability in their homes. Applicants can choose a combination from 15 different sustainability measures (with different point allocations) to integrate into their design. This includes the option for applicants to nominate their own sustainability measure.
