

# **LIBRARY NOW OPEN**

While restoration works take place at the Subiaco Library (E H Parker Library), the Subiaco Pop-up Library has opened at 241 Rokeby Road to provide continued services.

The pop-up library contains a large selection from the library's existing collection, as well as a dedicated children's library, ample seating with magazines and papers, study spaces, and a bookable meeting room.

The library team are continuing to run library events, including storytime, within the pop-up library and select events will take place outdoors in nearby grassed areas.

Mayor David McMullen said, "Hundreds of thousands of community members have visited the Subiaco Library (E H Parker Library) since its construction in 1971, and this restoration project will provide much needed improvements and enhancements to this iconic Subiaco landmark.

"We know this project will preserve this beloved building for many generations to come – and in the meantime, the community can enjoy continued library services at the Subiaco Pop-up Library."

### **SUBIACO WALK-IN CENTRE**

The City of Subiaco is taking action to assist people at risk of, or those currently experiencing, homelessness by engaging the Salvation Army to deliver a weekly Subiaco walk-in centre.

Located at The Third Place, the centre operates every Wednesday between 10am and 2pm to provide information, food, water, clothing, and sleeping bags to those who need it, as well as organise referrals to appropriate services including possible accommodation options.



The popular sunset@subi concert series is back this summer, with a variety of outdoor live music performances lined up. Kicking off with a special Christmas concert – complete with an appearance from Father Christmas himself – the concerts will run throughout summer and include a diverse range of musical acts including Chicago-style blues and a special tribute to the Seekers and The Blues Brothers.

Local distillery, Spirit of Little Things Gin, is serving up a range of botanical concoctions that are perfect for sipping on as the sun sets in the park, and a dedicated section of the market will be bustling with Perth's best vintage sellers.

City of Subiaco Mayor David McMullen said, "The City is proud to be supporting the night markets as key sponsor. This will be a signature event for our City this summer, and we anticipate people being drawn in from across Perth, to experience Subiaco at its best.

# RESIDENTIAL E-PERMIT PARKING IS HERE

Residential e-permits are here, replacing paper permits and providing a much quicker solution for parking in the City.

The new online system allows residents to apply for parking permits in just a couple of steps, with permits instantly valid from the time they're approved.

E-permits can't be lost or stolen, and put you in charge of the management of your permits.

Current permit holders will be transferred to the new system by City staff, and will be directly contacted when this has been completed.

# **PUBLIC REALM**UPGRADES CONTINUE

The City is continuing to invest in public community spaces to give parts of Rokeby Road a refresh, and create more useable, welcoming and attractive hubs for residents, workers, visitors and businesses to enjoy.



Seddon Street – which adjoins ONE Subiaco – is the most recent to open and encourages people to linger longer, as well as creating a space that can be used for vibrant community events.

An upgraded Postal Walk

– that recognises Subiaco's history and heritage through art – was unveiled in August, with Forrest Walk set for a makeover next.

As part of the City's Greenwalks project, Walmsley Lane also had a refresh to improve usability, enhance its character, increase canopy coverage and help increase sense of safety through lighting.

Mayor David McMullen said, "The City's investment in these shared public spaces will improve amenity and walkability, and encourage visitation and community use.

"These upgrades are part of the ongoing renewal of some key nodes, that will help generate momentum for our City."



### **NEW IN THE CITY**

A number of new eateries are getting ready to open their doors at ONE Subiaco in the coming weeks and months, proving that Subiaco's renaissance is only gaining momentum.

**Ozrif Burgers** is bringing another great burger option to the City; Maylands institution, **Commune Wine Store**, has chosen Subiaco for their second location; and the team behind local powerhouse, Shui, will be bringing big flavours to 2024 with **Larry's Charcoal Chicken**.

These new eateries will join a number of recently opened businesses, including **Market Caff**, **Pavilion Fresh Market** by MCQ, and **Saigon Alley** for authentic Vietnamese street food.

Other new openings across the City include **Bar Banter**, **Onyx and Smoke**, **Mara Collective**, **Chiill Sports**, and **Grain Bakery** in Shenton Park. **Mecca** has also expanded their space, making it a one-stop-shop for all your beauty buys.

### TEEN MEMBERSHIP NOW AT LORDS

As part of Lords Recreation Centre's mission to create a diverse and inclusive community, the team have introduced a new membership for teens aged 14 and 15.

It's designed for teenagers to access the gym and group fitness classes in a safe and supervised environment, while developing proper training techniques and growing their confidence.

To prioritise safety, all teen members need to complete two introductory appraisal sessions where they will talk through their fitness goals and be shown how to use all of the equipment in the gym. Independent access will be granted once both sessions are completed.

### **FOGO UPDATE**

It's been six months since FOGO started in the City and we've managed to reduce waste going to landfill by 20 per cent already, diverting more than 800 tonnes of methane producing organics. Contamination rates are low (around 2 per cent) with soft plastics accounting for most of this, so please remember to use compostable liners only in your kitchen caddy.



### BULK GREEN WASTE COLLECTION THIS DECEMBER

The City's next bulk green garden waste collection will commence on Monday 11 December. Please place loose green garden waste on your verge (not in bags) by the evening of Sunday 10 December. There is no limit to the quantity of green waste that you can put out.

### **HOLIDAY WASTE COLLECTION CHANGES**

Our waste staff will be spending Christmas Day and New Year's Day public holidays with their families, so there will be no waste collections on Monday 25 December 2023 and Monday 1 January 2024. As such, from Monday 25 December 2023 to Friday 5 January 2024, your waste will be collected one day later than usual. Normal waste services resume on Monday 8 January 2024.

### **WASTE TIPS FOR THE FESTIVE SEASON**

Waste increases by about 30 per cent at Christmas time, so we've put together some tips to help you reduce waste this silly season.

### **Avoid food waste**

- Pre-plan your meals.
- Check what food you have before you go shopping.
- Write a shopping list.
- Give away or freeze leftovers.

### Low-waste gifts

- Give experiences, donations or gift vouchers.
- Secret Santa is a fun way to reduce waste.
- Gift sustainable alternatives to single-use items like coffee cups and produce bags.

### Sustainable wrapping

- Reuse children's drawings or paintings as wrapping paper.
- Try Furoshiki a Japanese technique that uses reusable fabric wraps.
- Get creative and use tea towels, newspaper, a vintage scarf, reusable food wrap (such as beeswax wraps), or a stainlesssteel container.

### Is your recycling bin overflowing?

- Set-up a Containers for Change collection for eligible drink containers.
- Fold, flatten or cut up cardboard boxes to save space.
- Take your excess recyclables like cardboard, polystyrene, bottles or containers to the West Metro Recycling Centre (open every day except Christmas Day and New Year's Day).



This edition's tip comes from Waste Education and Project Officer Daniel to help us all FOGO with confidence and reduce waste to landfill.

- All festive food scraps (like ham bones, turkey carcasses, prawn/crayfish shells) go in the FOGO bin for weekly collection.
- Store large food scraps in the freezer and put them in the FOGO bin the night before collection.
- All take away coffee cups (including compostable), all meat trays (plastic and foam), and compostable food packaging (including bamboo) go in the general waste bin.
