



Upgrades at Rosalie Park complete

Rosalie Park now features a climbing wall, parkour equipment, a slide, balance logs and more, thanks to a major upgrade that has seen the space transform over the past 18 months.

These updates are part of Stage Two of the Rosalie Park mixed-use community space project, which aims to activate a previously underutilised area of the park.

Stage One, which was completed in April 2022, saw the creation of community garden beds, and the building of basketball, cricket, tennis, netball and ping pong facilities.

Controlled removal of invasive fish

The City is working with the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development and SLR Consulting to improve the health of the lakes at Lake Jualbup and Mabel Talbot Park.

Controlled removal of invasive carp (*Cyprinus carpio*) and goldfish (*Carassius auratus*) is required as the species prey on native fish, impact waterways by causing algal bloom, and have the potential to spread to other waterways if not managed.

The removal is expected to take place between Tuesday 13 and Wednesday 14 February 2024, and will allow the lakes to return to a more natural state. For more information see www.subiaco.wa.gov.au/news.
