A quick monthly update from Mayor David McMullen

Last week, our City featured in yet another prominent good news story, with The West Australian describing "Subi's second coming" as a "new era". In my reported comments I said, "Our city is only just gathering momentum, which will continue for years to come".

But let's not forget the great work City staff are doing every day.

About 100 people came to our first sustainability sundowner (pictured) to hear about sustainable development and our policy leadership in this space; we have announced a partnership with Dress for Success WA; and we are six months into delivery of a weekly homelessness walk-in service.

This is all newsworthy - no less so than the more visible parts to the City of Subiaco's "new era".

E-permit parking update

The introduction of e-permits commenced in August 2023 with digital commercial parking permits, followed by residential, visitor and temporary parking permits in November 2023. The system is part of the City's plans to improve parking opportunities for people living and working in Subiaco during business hours.

The City has been receiving helpful feedback from residents about the e-permit system and has been sharing it with our technology provider, and they are working hard to make a range of improvements to help make the system more user-friendly. A number of improvements to the user experience have already been implemented.
