## City launches first Reconciliation Action Plan

The City of Subiaco launched its first Reflect Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) at the Subiaco Arts Centre on Wednesday 29 April. Approved by the Council in November 2023, this plan marks a significant milestone in promoting cultural awareness and enhancing opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Mayor David McMullen emphasised the significance of the Reflect RAP.

“In the City of Subiaco’s long history, this is its first RAP,” he said. “Today’s Council and staff can be proud of what this signifies.”

The launch featured cultural performances, a Welcome to Country by Daniel Garlett, a smoking ceremony and the planting of a bushtucker garden. Dale Tilbrook, bushtucker expert, shared insights about Indigenous plants, demonstrating the importance of Indigenous knowledge.

The event coincided with National Reconciliation Week, tying in with reconciliation efforts across the nation.

Remarkably, the City has also achieved a low contamination rate of just two per cent, meaning almost all FOGO waste is diverted from landfill. In the first City-wide kerbside textile collection, residents donated a staggering 4,200kg of pre-loved goods to op shops. Ten per cent of households participated in the Good Sammy collection in April 2024, donating over 430 bags of clothing, shoes and accessories.
