### New business hub supporting growth and diversity of Subiaco's economy

A new business hub supported by the City is bringing Curtin University students to Subiaco to help encourage growth and diversity of the local economy, and increase footfall in the town centre.

The hub – on Rowland Street, just off the main Rokeby Road strip – is serving as an off-campus studio space for the university's School of Design and Built Environment students and activates a previously underutilised prime office location owned by Hiddlestone Bros.

The space initially formed as part of a partnership between Hiddlestone Bros, the City of Subiaco and Curtin University's School of Design and Built Environment with ongoing collaboration planned.

Subiaco Mayor Penny Taylor said: "This initiative is not only helping to support growth and diversity of our local economy and community, it's also ensuring the next generation of entrepreneurs and creatives are real-world ready."

The Hiddlestone family have a long history with Subiaco's business community having celebrated their centenary in Subiaco last year.

## Locals get behind Containers for Change scheme

City residents have taken the new Containers for Change initiative in their stride, helping to contribute to a circular economy and donate much-needed funds to those who need it.

Western Australians have recycled more than 283 million containers since the initiative started in October last year, with over \$1.2 million being donated to 3000 charities and community groups.

City residents can take eligible drink containers direct to the depot at Paraquad Industries – which is run by Return-It – for the 10c refund, or donate containers at the West Metro Recycling Centre who will pass on the proceeds to Paraquad Industries on your behalf.

## City celebrates 10 years as Waterwise Council

The City is celebrating 10 years of being a Waterwise Council this year, after being recently re-endorsed as a gold council by the Water Corporation.

To mark the occasion, the City was gifted a commemorative park bench which has been installed in Cliff Sadlier Reserve near the recently completed living stream.

Subiaco Mayor Penny Taylor said with the impacts of climate change on our water supplies, it's incredibly important for organisations to manage water sustainably.

"It's important that local governments lead by example and, not only help their community to implement 'greener' practices, but also make sustainable living the norm and a regular part of our daily operations," she said.

The City was one of the first councils to be awarded gold recognition and was the first to receive platinum for outstanding work on reducing water consumption and increasing water quality in 2017.

Western Australians aged 50 and over can now get vaccinated against COVID-19 at four state-run community vaccination clinics, including one at Claremont Showgrounds.

The clinics are open between 8.30am and 3.30pm, seven days a week but bookings are essential – they can be made by calling 13 COVID (13 268 43).

Select GP clinics are also rolling out the vaccine.
