Subiaco East active green space response from Premier

In July, Council resolved to send a letter to the Premier and the Chair of DevelopmentWA requesting consideration of providing additional active green space in the Subiaco East development area.

The City recently received a response from the Premier that referred to the extensive community and stakeholder engagement consultation over a two year period, as well as describing the 4.6 hectares of new public open space.

The response concluded by stating: "given the status of the Master Plan and the subsequent approvals that have been obtained to start delivery, the Government does not intend to modify the planning for Subi East to accommodate additional active green space".

In accordance with the council resolution, a report will go to the next Ordinary Council Meeting to consider any ancillary actions.

The City of Subiaco is inviting public comment on:

- Draft Local Planning Policy
 8.3 Percent for public art and

Policy amendments are recommended to undertake administrative updates, provide new and amended provisions for development application consultation processes, simplify consideration of holiday periods when calculating the duration of consultation periods, and delete provisions duplicated in the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015.*

The policy provides discretionary criteria to assess variations to non-residential car parking standards, and provides guidance for the requirement for Transport Impact Assessments, Parking Management Plans and Travel Plans submitted in support of development applications.
