Hay Street stabilisation works update

The City granted a two-week extension to the building order to stabilise 424-436 Hay Street.

Property owner, Sanur, requested the extension after a number of unforeseen incidents – including flooding due to the recent heavy rain – that affected plans to proceed with the work.

Sanur is now working with the City's heritage consultant to begin the stabilisation work that will enable the full extent of the road to reopen.

The works now need to be completed by **Friday 20 August**.

Nicholson Road Streetscape

The City is seeking feedback on five possible proposals for Nicholson Road after receiving a request for extra parking between Hensman Road and Rosalie Street.

The proposals range from no change to traffic calming measures such as a median strip and plateau speed humps.

Reduced speed limits make roads safer

The City successfully advocated for speed limit reductions on three Subiaco roads to enhance safety, make limits more consistent and allow for future development.

Parts of Salvado Road, Haydn Bunton Drive, and Townsend Road were all 60km/h zones but have now been reduced to 50km/h.

The City collected traffic data and worked with Main Roads Western Australia and Town of Cambridge to make the changes possible.

Draft amended local planning policies

The City of Subiaco is inviting public comment on draft amended Local Planning Policy 8.2 – Advertisements (Signs) and draft Local Planning Policy 7.8 – 3D Modelling Requirements for Development Applications.

Policy 8.2 is recommended to be amended to align the policy with the City's updated local planning policy template, undertake minor textual changes to clarify existing provisions, provide clear exemption criteria for advertisements and new assessment criteria for advertisements.

Policy 7.8 is proposed to introduce a requirement for specific development applications to be accompanied by a 3D model to improve communication and engagement, and assist assessment and decision-making.

Finalisation of local planning policies

At the City of Subiaco Ordinary Council Meeting held on 20 July, Council proceeded with Local Planning Policy 7.5 'Planning Compliance'. The policy provides a clear process and guidance for the resolution of planning compliance matters.

At the same meeting, Council also proceeded with minor amendments to Local Planning Policy 3.5 'Development guidelines for places on the Heritage List'. The policy guides the development of places on the Heritage List. The amendments ensure that the policy is consistent with the current planning framework and clarify the existing provisions. The amendments do not alter the intent of the policy.
